



Scholarship Information and Criteria

ACER

Each year the College will award two scholarships, one each to a prospective Year 7 and Year 8 student, based on their results in the Australian Cooperative Entry Programme (ACEP) examinations.

Open to new and current students entering Year 7 and Year 8 in the following year.

The scholarships will provide for the remission of 25 percent of the annual student charges each year of the student's secondary schooling at Woodcroft College.

Music

Open to two new or current students entering Year 7 and Year 8 in the following year. One Scholarship will be awarded at each year level.

Written applications should be sent to Director of Music and address to the following criteria:

- Musical education to date and level of proficiency attained.
- Current commitment to school music and/or private tuition.
- Intended commitment to the music program at Woodcroft College.
- Musical aspirations for the future.

Applicants will need to demonstrate a proficiency at playing a musical instrument (including voice) through an audition process.

Applicants will be shortlisted for the audition and interview stage with the Director of Music and members of the music teaching staff. Scholarships will be awarded on the recommendation of the Director of Music.

The scholarships will provide for the remission of 25 percent of the annual student charges for each year of the student's secondary schooling at Woodcroft College.

High Performance Athletes Program (HPAP)

Each year the College will award two scholarships to new and current students entering Year 10 the following year and who are competing at a State or National representation level.

Written applications should be sent to the HPAP Coordinator and address the following criteria:

- Confirmation of representation in sport of choice at State or National level (must be current).
- Character reference from State or National Coach.
- Academic progress and achievement including copy of most recent school report.
- Supporting letter from parent.
- Sporting aspirations for the future.

Applicants will be shortlisted by the HPAP Coordinator. Scholarships will be awarded on the recommendation of the HPAP Coordinator and the Head of Senior School following an interview.

The scholarships will provide for the remission of 25 percent of the annual student charges for three consecutive years of the student's secondary schooling at Woodcroft College.

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Mark Porter Academic Entry Award – Middle and Senior School Entry

Two scholarships have been created to honour the significant contribution made by Mark Porter over the term of his, near, 30 year relationship with the College and will be awarded to new students only.

Written applications for both scholarships should be sent to the Head of College and address the following criteria:

- Current academic achievement.
- Intended commitment to academic endeavours at Woodcroft College.
- Character reference from current teacher.
- Supporting letter from parent.
- Aspirations for the future.

Middle School Entry

Each year the College will award one scholarship to a new Year 7 student entering the College based on academic achievement.

Based on application this scholarship will provide for the remission of 25 percent of the annual student charges each year of the student's secondary schooling at Woodcroft College.

Senior School Entry

Each year the College will award one scholarship to a new Year 10 student entering the College based on academic achievement. Preference will be given to students intending to study the IB Diploma in Year 11 and 12.

Based on application this scholarship will provide for the remission of 50 percent of the annual student charges each year of the student's secondary schooling at Woodcroft College.

Applications will be reviewed by Mark Porter and scholarships will be awarded on his recommendation by the Head of College.

- Academic progress and achievement including copy of most recent school report.
- Collegial character.
- Supporting letter from parent.
- Acts in accordance with the Christian values of the College

Written applications should be sent to the Head of College and address the following criteria:

- Direct contribution to College life and the wider community.
- Academic endeavour and progress including copy of most recent school report.
- Collegial character.
- Supporting letter from parent.
- Acts in accordance with the Christian values of the College.

Named Family Scholarship recipients are selected by representatives from each of the families. Scholarships will be awarded on their recommendation by the Head of College.

Each scholarship is offered on an annual basis and will provide for the remission of 25 percent of the annual student charges for one year only.
